



HISTORICAL SITES

DARIBA NUNGGALINYA (Old Man Rock) H1

-Larrakia sacred site, can be seen from Casuarina beach at low tide.

BATTLE SITE & BURIAL GROUND H2

-located at the mouth of Rapid Creek, on Casuarina beach, in front of a large fig tree. It was at this site where a battle was probably fought between Alligator River people against the Larrakia and Woolna tribes from the Rapid Creek Mission. This is said to have occurred in the late 1880s.

MOUTH OF RAPID CREEK (Opposite Beachfront Hotel) H3

-site for bush tucker collection (both plants and shellfish)

-camping site for Aboriginal people

-presence of natural springwater (underground)

-vegetation and trees cut down during war years (1940s) tosafe guard against a further Japanese invasion

-site for fishing and trapping crocodiles

H4 MANGROVE SITE

-scraps of metal, barbed wire, star pickets buried in the mangrove mud during the 1940s to thwart a potential Japanese invasion by boat.

MANGROVE SITES H5-H7

-the damage done to mangroves during Cyclone Tracy is still evident today with some very big dead trees lying on the ground.

WATER GARDENS H8

-site of Rapid Creek Mission ran by the Jesuits (1882-1891). Larrakia and Woolna people lived on this Mission intermittently during this period.

YANKEE POOL, MARRARA H9

-a popular recreational site for the armed forces during the servicemen were American personnel based in Darwin. This pool may have been created through the use of dynamite.

OTHER HISTORICAL SITES

NIGHTCLIFF FISH TRAP (at the end of Aralia St, Nightcliff rocks). 1. -significant site for Larrakia people where they used to catch fish traditionally. It is a rock wall which at high tide is covered by water. At low tide it is exposed. The rock wall is used to trap fish according to the changing tides.

CLIFFS OF THE NIGHTCLIFF COAST 2.

- -site of rich jungle, caves, bush fowls, many bird species before residential development.
- -Rapid Creek Mission boundaries extended to this point.
- -this was the site of a large garbage chute, used in the war years. (1940s).

MISSION WELL

-the site of the Rapid Creek Mission Well is located in Earl Place, Millner.

MISSION BUILDINGS

-the main buildings of the Rapid Creek Mission (1882-1891) were located on the corner of Ryland Road and Pinder Street, Millner.
